Booking for Parents' Evening has gone live today. Please make sure you complete this at your earliest convenience. We are looking forward to meeting you to discuss the progress your child has made.

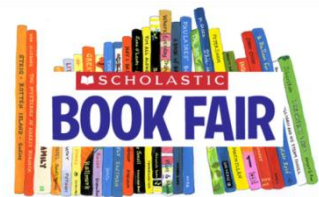
World Book Day

LEARNING NEWS



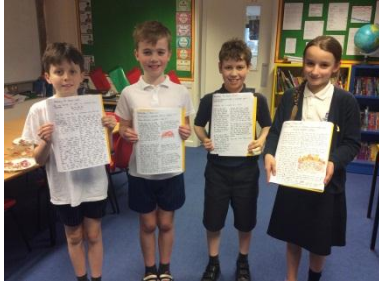
The children in **Foundation Stage** have been busy setting up growing experiments this week. They asked lots of questions and made predictions based on what they already know about planting and growing bean plants. They will continue to observe their experiments over the rest of the term.



After our unexpected Snow Days, **Years 1/2** started the week by writing about the exciting time we had making snowmen, sledging and making snowballs at home. In R.E. we have been thinking about Palm Sunday, and this week we used a variety of drama techniques to recreate Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem. We had so much fun imagining how Jesus may have felt and thinking of questions to ask him.



This term **Years 3/4** have been investigating how electricity works and looking at simple circuits. The children have been looking at a variety of different circuits and predicting whether the circuits would work by how they were put together. They were then super scientists and created their own working circuits using a bulb and a battery!
